


ISSUES AND OPTIONS FOR SUDBURY TOWN

Our vision is for a greener, cleaner, safer Sudbury Town. We want "to revitalise Sudbury town centre as a place that we can all be proud of and which is at the heart of community life, where a wide range of retail, community, leisure and cultural facilities are encouraged, creating a vibrant, attractive, welcoming and accessible centre for all, at all times of the day".

We organised a walkabout of the town centre in May. This was attended by a mix of residents, businesses, locally-based organisations, Council officers and members. During the walkabout, people told us what they like and don't like about Sudbury Town, and what should be done to improve it. The comments made have led to identifying a series of options for improving Sudbury Town (see opposite).

OPTIONS FOR IMPROVING SUDBURY TOWN

Investigate how the quality and appearance of the town centre could be improved, including:

- Improved pedestrian crossings, planting new trees, increasing the width of pavements, redesigning and repaving the Sudbury & Harrow Road railway station forecourt area.
- Relocating bus stands to reduce congestion and the visual impact of waiting busses in the town centre.
- Introduce new cycle parking spaces and areas of new seating.
- Improve the quality of the environment below the railway bridge to improve the 'welcome' to the town centre, possible through new feature lighting or public art.
- Establish guidance on the quality of shop fronts and use of signage on buildings and on pavements.

Promote improved accessibility to and within Sudbury Town, which could include:

- Campaigning for improved and more frequent rail services at Sudbury & Harrow Railway Station.
- Better pedestrian crossing points, particularly across Harrow Road to Barham Park.
- Investigating traffic flows and looking at how congestion might be reduced in the town centre.
- Looking into how parking space in and around the town centre might be better used.

Enhancing the mix of shops, services and facilities in Sudbury Town, including:

- Encouraging a greater diversity of activities in the town centre and putting in place policies that limit the number of betting shops and hot-food takeaways.
- Reuse or redevelop the toilet block in Butler's Green for other uses, including a cafe or weekly farmers market.
- Promote the reuse of space in Barham Park for community facilities, such as a reopened
